

We will not have our usual pitch-in type meal but your Pioneer Country Board Members will purchase snacks for y'all. And we will provide those AFTER the praise and worship service, instead of our usual practice of eating something before service.

The social time and the worship time are both open attendance. You do not need to have already attended a Walk to Emmaus to be able to come join us. Please, members, contact your friends and family members and invite them to come enjoy this time with us. There's no better way to get to know folks than to come and eat and then worship with Holy Communion together. Potential candidates for upcoming walks would certainly enjoy the chance to socialize and get a feel for what our Emmaus Community is like.

St. Matthew United Methodist Church, 300 North Air De-pot, Midwest City OK, 73110.

Our Pioneer Country Emmaus Gathering for September 2021 will be held at St Matthew UMC, 300 North Air Depot, Midwest City, OK .

From Stillwater, about 1 hour and 7 min (64.6 mi) via OK-33 W and I-35 S . Follow I35 South . Keep left at the fork to stay on I-35 S, follow signs for Okla. City/Dallas . Take exit 129 toward N.E 10th St . Merge onto NE Grand Blvd . Turn left onto NE 10th St . Turn right onto N Air Depot Blvd . Turn left at N Meadow Ln . Destination will be on the left , 300 N Air Depot, Midwest City, OK.

From Enid, about 1 hour and 35 min (100.7 mi) via US 412 E and I35 South. Take 412 East . Take the exit onto I-35 S/US-64 E toward Perry/Okla. City. Keep left at the fork to stay on I-35 S, follow signs for Okla. City/Dallas . Take exit 129 toward N.E 10th St . Merge onto NE Grand Blvd . Turn left on- to NE 10th St . Turn right onto N Air Depot Blvd . Turn left at N Meadow Ln . Destina- tion will be on the left , 300 N Air Depot, Midwest City, OK.

From Moore, about 20 min (15 mi) via I-35 N . Take I-35 N/I-40 E/US-62 E toward Wichita/Ft Smith. Keep left at the fork to continue on I-40 E/US-270 E, follow signs for Fort Smith. Take exit 155A toward Sunny Lane Rd/ Del City. Merge onto I- 40 Srv Rd/Tinker Diagonal St. Turn left onto S Sunnyslane Rd. Turn right onto Reno Ave. Turn left after Precision Tune Auto Care (on the right). Turn right. Destination will be on the right. 300 N Air Depot Blvd, Midwest City, OK 73110.

From Piedmont, about 40 min (34 mi) via I40 East. From Piedmont Rd North, turn left onto Northwest Expressway. Turn right onto N Morgan Rd. Merge onto John Kilpatrick Turnpike .Take the exit onto I-40 E Keep left at the fork to continue on I-40 E/US-270 E, follow signs for Fort Smith. Take exit 155A toward Sunny Lane Rd/Del City. Merge onto I- 40 Srv Rd/Tinker Diagonal St. Turn left onto S Sunnyslane Rd. Turn right onto Reno Ave. Turn left after Precision Tune Auto Care (on the right). Turn right. Destination will be on the right. 300 N Air Depot Blvd, Midwest City, OK 73110.

Let's Meet Jeff Bull

As I started to type this article for the Newsletter, I realize that unless we worked on a walk together, there was a good chance that you might not know me. With that in mind, here goes.

I was born and raised outside of Erie PA, on the shores of Lake Erie in Fairview. I was very active in learning and serving at St. Stephens Episcopal Church. And yes, serving was the primary activity as a child and all through my teen years. Why you might ask...well I grew up in my father's image and YES he was VERY active in the church. My activity dropped to almost zero during college undergrad and graduate school. Oh, almost forgot, my wife and I were married on the day we both graduated from Iowa State University with bachelor's degrees. Note! Your Pioneer Country Emmaus Board members are utilizing ZOOM for gatherings, so here are some instructions for getting zoom on your laptop or mobile device...

HOW TO GET STARTED WITH ZOOM

1. For Desktop

Step 1: To get started with Zoom, head to [their website](#), and click on the “SIGN UP” button that’s at the top-right corner of the screen.

Step 2: You have two options when it comes to creating a Zoom account.

You can either: 1. Create a new account using your email address. Or 2. Sign in using SSO (Single Sign-On) or your Google or Facebook account.

If you’re using Zoom for work purpose, it’s best to sign up using your work email address.

Step 3: Zoom will now send you an email with a confirmation link.

Click on that link to go to Zoom’s Sign Up Assistant and sign in using your credentials.

Step 4: Download the desktop app/ Zoom client from the Zoom website for easy access.

2. For Mobile options—phone or ipad etc

Step 1: Download the Zoom iOS or Android app from the App Store/Play Store.

Step 2: Sign up or sign in to Zoom by following the on-screen instructions that are similar to the desktop process.
