In February, we published a survey, requesting input from the Pioneer Country Emmaus Community, regarding monthly gatherings. We are experiencing a decline in attendance. We had requests from several members to change the gatherings, and that was the incentive for posting a survey. **Results of survey, which closed April 13, 2019, change social time 5:30-6:30. Worship begins at 6:30.**

What do you know about sponsorship?

Sponsorship may be the most important job in Emmaus.

Good sponsorship is vital to the integrity of Emmaus. Many communities take sponsorship for granted; they assume that everyone knows the how and why of sponsorship.

It is more than just “signing up people”. The quality of sponsorship influences the pilgrim, the health of the Emmaus Movement, and the church affected by the movement.

First, good sponsorship is your first act of agape before a Walk ever begins; the experience of the Walk for a pilgrim really starts with how we handle sponsorship.

Second, good sponsorship undergirds the whole weekend with sacrificial love on behalf of each pilgrim. Sponsors use discernment in recruiting pilgrims, embody the personal commitment of the community to each pilgrim, and provide personal acts of agape during the three days for the pilgrims. These acts of agape include the sponsor’s personal preparations for the weekend, presence at Send off, Candlelight and Closing, follow-up after the weekend, and prayer during the entire process.

Third, good sponsorship is the foundation for a healthy, effective Emmaus movement that is fulfilling its true purpose – the development of Christian leaders and the renewal of the church in ministry. The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of its recruiting practices. If the community is committed to recruiting strong church leaders for the purpose of strengthening the local church, then the community will be a strong, vital force in the renewal movement. If, on the other hand, the Walk to Emmaus is looked upon as a hospital where every human ill can be cured, it will have a weakening effect on the entire community.

Wesley United Methodist Church, 101 S. Baker, El Reno, Oklahoma

Our Pioneer Country Emmaus Gathering for June, 2019, will be held at Wesley United Methodist Church, in El Reno, Oklahoma.

From Stillwater, via I-35 S and I-40 W, Fastest route, the usual traffic, about an hour and 37 minutes. Follow I-35 S and I-40 W to I-40BL W/US-81 N in El Reno. Take the US-81 N exit from I-40 W . Take Rte 66 to S Barker Ave .

From Enid, via US-81 S, Fastest route, the usual traffic, about an hour and 14 minutes. Head south on S Grand Ave toward W Maine St. Turn right onto W Owen K Garriott Rd. Use the left 2 lanes to turn left onto US-81 S/S Van Buren St. Continue to follow US-81 S. Use the right lane to take the US-81 S ramp to El Reno. Continue onto US-81 S. Turn left onto W Woodson St. Turn right at the 3rd cross street onto S Barker Ave. Destination will be on the left.

From Moore, via I-40 W, Fastest route, the usual traffic, about 40 minutes. Follow I-35 N/US-77 N and I-40 W to I-40BL W/US-81 N in El Reno. Take the US-81 N exit from I-40 W . Take Rte 66 to S Barker Ave

From Piedmont, via W Britton Rd, Fastest route, the usual traffic, about 30 minutes. Head north on NW 1st St toward Monroe Ave NW. Turn right at the 1st cross street onto Monroe Ave NW. Turn right at the 1st cross street onto Piedmont Rd N. Turn right onto W Britton Rd. Turn left onto US-81 S. Turn left onto W Woodson St. Turn right at the 3rd cross street onto S Barker Ave. Destination will be on the left.

EMMAUS

The walk to Emmaus is an experi-
ence of Christian spiritual renewal
and formation that begins with a
three-day short course in Christiani-
ty. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus
Christ in a new way as God's grace
and love is revealed to you through
other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus experience
begins with the prayerful discern-
ment and invitation from a spon-
sor. After one accepts this invitation
they complete an application. The
Emmaus leaders prayerfully consid-
er each applicant and in God's time,
the person is invited to attend a
three-day experience of New Testa-
ment Christianity as a lifestyle.

Following the three-day experience,
participants are joined in small
groups to support each other in their
ongoing walk with Christ.

About the 4th Day...

As participants conclude their Walk to Emmaus weekends, they are introduced to the concept of the Fourth Day -- a symbol of the days of Christian pilgrimage that follow the three-day Emmaus experience. The Walk to Emmaus is a unique opportunity to reflect on one's faith journey and make a deeper commitment to Christ. In fact, the whole reason for The Walk to Emmaus is to make you a more faithful disciple and active member in your church. Thus, the Fourth Day is central to the Emmaus experience, as it extends each individual's experience beyond the weekend and into life in the world.

In living their Fourth Days, participants are encouraged to continue to grow in relationship with Christ and live as faithful disciples in all of life. An important and necessary foundation for faithful Christian living is a vital connection to the Christian community for support, guidance, and challenge. This is most available through local church communities, reunion groups, and the Emmaus/Chrysalis Celebrations. Another way to be connected to the support of the Christian community is through studying the writings of our brothers and sisters in Christ.
