Our Pioneer Country Emmaus Gathering for January 2020, will be held at The Church of The Good Shepherd UMC in Yukon, OK.

<u>From Stillwater</u>, about 1 hour and 15 min (77.2 mi) via OK-33 W and John KilpatrickTurnpike. Take Highway 33 to Guthrie. Merge onto I-35 S . Follow I35 South to John Kilpatrick Turnpike. Take the turnpike to Southwest 15th Street. Turn left onto SW15th. Then turn right, turn right. 10928 SW 15th Street, Yukon, OK, 73099.

From Enid, about 1 hour and 31 min (77.8 mi) via OK-US 81 S. Take S Van Buren Street to continue on to OK3 E / Northwest Expressway. Turn right on N Morgan Rd. Merge onto Kilpatrick Turnpike. Take the turnpike to Southwest 15th Street. Turn left onto SW15th. Then turn right, turn right. 10928 SW 15th Street, Yukon, OK, 73099.

From Moore, about 25 min (23.1 mi) via I-35 N and I-40 W . N Broadway St toward NW 2nd St . Turn left onto NW 5th St . Turn right onto I-35 Frontage Rd/N Service Rd . Continue straight (signs for I-35 N/US-77 N) . Merge onto I-35 N/US-77 N . Continue onto I-235 N/US-77 N (signs for Oklahoma Health Center) . Take exit 126 on left for Interstate 40 W toward Amarillo. Take I40 to exit 138-139 for OK 4 toward Mustang/Yukon. Merge onto John Kilpatrick Turnpike. Take ramp to SW 15th. Turn left onto SW15th. Then turn right, turn right. 10928 SW 15th Street, Yukon, OK, 73099.

From Piedmont, about 21 min (16 mi) via John Kilpatrick Turnpike. From Piedmont Rd North, turn left onto Northwest Expressway. Turn right onto N Morgan Rd. Merge onto John Kilpatrick Turnpike .Take the exit ramp to SW 15th. Turn Right, turn right. 10928 SW 15th Street, Yukon, OK, 73099.

Valentine's Day, also called **Saint Valentine's Day** or the **Feast of Saint Valentine**,^[2] is celebrated annually on February 14. Originating as a Western Christian <u>feast</u> day honoring one or two early saints named <u>Valentinus</u>, Valentine's Day is recognized as a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of <u>romance</u> and romantic <u>love</u> in many regions around the world.

There are numerous <u>martyrdom</u> stories associated with various Valentines connected to February 14,^[3] including a written account of <u>Saint Valentine</u> of Rome's imprisonment for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians <u>persecuted under</u> <u>the Roman Empire</u>.^[4] According to legend, Saint Valentine restored sight to the blind daughter of his judge,^[5] and he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell before his execution.^[6] The Feast of Saint Valentine was established by <u>Pope Gelasius I</u> in AD 496 to be celebrated on February 14 in honour of the Christian martyr, Saint Valentine of Rome, who died on that date in AD 269.^{[7][8]}

The day first became associated with romantic love within the circle of <u>Geoffrey Chaucer</u> in the 14th century, when the tradition of <u>courtly love</u> flourished. In 18th-century England, it grew into an occasion in which couples expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Valentine's Day symbols that are used today include the heart-shaped outline, doves, and the figure of the
