The Fall Walks are almost here! Men's Walk #127 is scheduled for October 4th - 7th, and Women's Walk #128 is scheduled for October 18th - 21st at First United Methodist Church - Downtown Oklahoma City. **Don Ellis** is the Lay Director for the Men's Walk and **Judie Ellis** is the Lay Director for the Women's Walk. They have each built strong teams who have been commissioned and have participated in three Team Training sessions. The fourth and final training session and walk-thru will take place on Saturday, September 22nd.

As you will recall, your Pioneer Country Emmaus Board of Directors decided that all future Walks will require a minimum of 20 registrants two weeks prior to the Walk date. If 20 completed applications are not in the hands of the Board by that two week prior date, that Walk will be postponed until the next scheduled Walk.

At the present time, we have 14 men and 18 women signed up for the walks. We are asking that the Community help to fill enough chairs so that we are able to hold the Fall set of Walks and make a difference in the lives of the Pilgrims. Thank you for your dedication of prayer.




