

About The Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The original form of this prayer of the church dates back to the eleventh or twelfth century. In its earliest use, the prayer was used responsively. When the Walk to Emmaus left the Catholic Cursillo, we retained the use of this prayer, even though we pray it as a unison prayer and not a responsive prayer.

Why do we pray the same prayer over and over on the walks?

During your weekend, you were invited to pray the "Prayer to the Holy Spirit" before each talk. That gave you the opportunity to really learn the prayer as it was said fourteen times. How many of you actually learned it? Really learning the prayer allows one to actually pray it rather than recite it.

Consider what we are asking God in this prayer.

Come Holy Spirit: fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in us the fire of your love.

We are calling upon God, by the Holy Spirit, to be in the hearts of all who believe and to awaken in them a burning desire to have the same love that is in Jesus.

Send fourth your Spirit, and we shall be created, and you will renew the face of the earth.

When God gives God's spirit to those who are seeking for true life, a re-creation takes place that begins to change people and the whole world.

O God, who by the light of the Holy spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful: grant that by the same Holy spirit, we may be truly wise and ever enjoy your consolations.

We acknowledge that the great men and women of faith in past generations are a reminder that we can also become like them and live in true wisdom with God and each other, now and forever.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

This is all possible because God loved the world so much that His only Son was given, so that all who put their trust in Jesus as Lord and Savior will not perish but have life unending.

PIONEER COUNTRY TO OFFER DAY 4 RESTORE

Emmaus Ministries exists to inspire, challenge, and equip local faith communities for Christian actions in their homes, churches, communities, and places of work. This purpose does not come to full realization for its participants during the Emmaus Ministries event itself but in the many days that follow.


Emmaus Ministries expands participants' spiritual lives, deepens their faith and discipleship, and rekindles—or perhaps ignites for the first time—their gifts as Christian leaders for their churches and communities. These aims are accomplished not only during the Emmaus Ministries event itself but also through participation in follow-up spiritual support groups and community fellowship opportunities, sponsorship, prayer, support of other Emmaus Ministries events, and service on support committees and on teams.

Persons whose spiritual lives are renewed and strengthened through Emmaus Ministries are called and empowered to be the hands and feet of Christ—to share within their communities the grace they received. They become energetic and renewing catalysts in their homes, places of work or education, and local communities of faith. While walking together with other Christians, they actively participate in God's mission to the world.

Day Four Restore has been created to refresh the spirit and renew the commitment of those who have attended any Fourth Day movement events. It is intended to be held annually for the growth of the Fourth Day community and to empower leaders to look for growth in ministry beyond the Fourth Day community. It is your chance to renew your spirit and regain some of the excitement you felt after your Walk.

Pioneer Country Emmaus would like to offer the Day Four Restore program to our community if there is enough interest. It is open to everyone who has been on a Walk, a Chrysalis Flight, Cursillo, Tres Dias, or any other fourth day program, including Kairos and Kairos Outside. We would offer Day Four Restore in a virtual format using Zoom, which would allow us to have more participants. It is held on a Saturday, starts at 9:00 AM and runs until about 4:00 PM with a lunch break. Cost is \$25. 
