Ministry Manager

For several years, I have had the opportunity to serve as a website administrator for Pioneer Country Emmaus. We have worked with two websites. The newer one stores our board meeting minutes, newsletters, and other data files, as well as a database of our members. The old website was used mainly for recording everyone's participation. That website has become obsolete and is no longer supported. That is where Ministry Manager comes in.

What is Ministry Manager? Ministry Manager is a community management application that enables Emmaus Ministries to collect, store, and use information to conduct the mission of the ministry and communicate with the members. It has been provided by the Upper Room for use by Emmaus communities. There are numerous advantages to using Ministry Manager. The three key attributes of the application are:

(#1) Ministry Manager is designed for our ministries. Information is formatted and compartmented in a logical manner; all of our community information is stored in a secure location and linked to our community activities. By using Ministry Manager, Pioneer Country can maintain a person's progressive servanthood and help in team selection.

(#2) Our community board can leave the tasks of server maintenance and data security to the administrators.

(#3) Ministry Manager correlates with and supports Emmaus Ministries standard models. Only information that is relevant to Emmaus Ministries is collected and stored. Each Emmaus Ministry community enters, maintains, and controls the information entered in Ministry Manager for their community. Access to Ministry Manager is controlled through the assignment of various roles and permissions to individuals.

Each person added to the Ministry Manager application must have a unique email address. Some people may share an email address with another person in their daily life. For the purpose of Ministry Manager access, only one person can have an account established under a single email address. After a person's name and email address are added to Ministry Manager, Ministry Manager sends an email invitation to the email address, and the individual responds to the invitation to establish an account. Later, a community manager will assign a role to control the level of access, based on their needs. The possible roles are community member, community leader, and board of directors. If an individual member does not have an email address, don't worry! The individual can still be added to the Ministry Manager database, they can continue their normal community activities, and their service history will remain in the application. When the person obtains a unique email address, it can be added to their profile, and that person can then be assigned to a role with access.

In Ministry Manager you will be able to send messages to other community members, sign up on prayer vigils, and your progressive servanthood will be tracked.

When you receive an email that you have been added to Ministry Manager, please respond to that email and complete your profile so that we have accurate information about you.

Pioneer Country Walk to Emmaus Progressive Servanthood

Pilgrims finishing their Walk often ask, "How do I get back in the conference room?" The answer to that question is "Progressive Servanthood". As you become familiar with Emmaus and/or Chrysalis, you "progress" through a hierarchy that leads you to being back in the conference room. There are no hard and fast rules, but generally a person starts by serving behind the scenes. That might be helping out in the kitchen, or with snacks, agape or serving as a Team Assistant or Musician on a Walk or Flight. After having done that a couple of times, you are eligible to be a Table Leader, then an Assistant Table Leader and you give a talk. After filling these roles two or three times, you can become an Assistant Lay Director. Eventually you can serve as a Weekend Lay Director. There are guidelines that are used to qualify a person for each position. There can be and are exceptions based on the needs of the community. We keep track of your Servanthood in a database provided by the Upper Room called Ministry Manager. When you receive an email stating you have been added to Ministry Manager er, please, please, login and complete your profile. (See the Ministry Manager article in this newsletter.)




