This Message serves as a combined State of Community Message as well as a Plea for Help.

As we closed out 2021 and entered 2022, the community finds itself in a state of need. Yes, the primary cause is the COVID pandemic that has caused us to:

Cancel Gatherings for most of the past 2 years.

Cancel Emmaus Walks with the last Walks occurring in September 2019.

Cancel Chrysalis Flights with the last Flights occurring in January 2020.

Conduct business with an understaffed Board of Directors requiring some board members to take on multiple jobs and board members having to serve longer than a standard 3 year term.

Conduct Board meetings without having quorum meaning no specific actions could be taken.

Note: It is very hard to guide a community of any type when the community cannot meet face to face.

We have had a very successful initiative to eliminate the use of the foam mattresses as the community raised sufficient funds to purchase 75 cots. THANK EVERYONE OF YOU that contributed to make this happen.

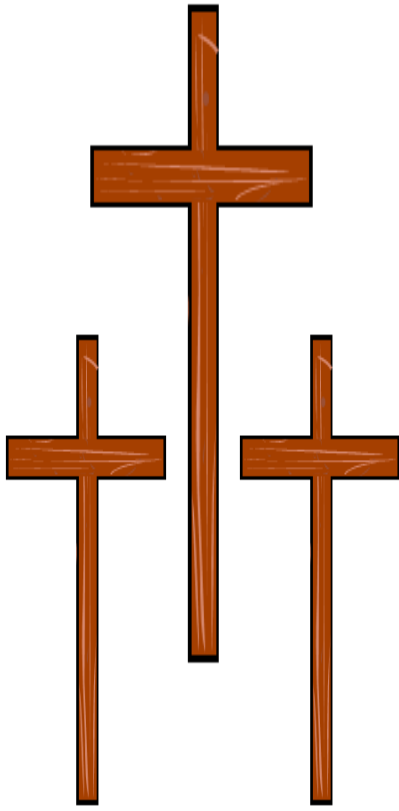
WE NEED at LEAST 1 more Board Member to meet the requirements of the PCE By-Laws.

voicing out our need and hope and gratitude and longing.

When we are singing, I can feel the better world coming,
and if I get to be a part of it, you do too . . .

so sing with me,

and we'll make our way down that blessed road together,
collectively better
than we ever thought
possible.

Personal Confession:

I copied the previous page from a friend and put it in this Newsletter because it means something to me. At the start of the Pandemic we watched our Church services online. At first it was only a sermon, then a couple of musicians were added that played some songs we knew.
