READY TO TAKE THE NEXT STEP WITH EMMAUS? COME LEARN HOW

Community Training and Team Orientation for Walks #123 & 124 will be held July 30, 2011, at Church of the Servant. Everyone is invited to attend the Praise and Worship Service and Flow of the Weekend, and then choose one of the following breakout sessions:

Preparing & Giving A Talk - for those who have been a Table Leader before and would like to learn more about giving a talk and what is expected of Assistant Table Leaders. All Assistant Table Leaders on the October Walks will be in this session.

Table Leader Training - for those who have worked behind the scenes in various capacities and want to prepare for their first time back in the Conference Room. All Table Leaders on the October Walks will be in this session.

Prayer Room, Musicians, Kitchen/Snacks, Dining Room/Agape or Team Assistants - for anyone who would like to know what goes on in these areas may choose the one they want to learn about. If you are interested in serving in one of these areas and never have, this is a good introduction. All Behind-the-Scenes Managers on the October Walks will be in their respective sessions.

Board of Directors - This session has been added for those of you considering running for the 2012 Emmaus Board. With Elections in October, you might want to hear about each of the Board positions and how your Board works for the Community.

The Gift Help For Local Emmaus Communities Worldwide

Dear Community,

Following is a new program started by The Upper Room entitled "The Gift". This program can mean so much to those communities who have so little. We began introducing this to our new Pilgrims at the March Fourth Day Meetings and collected over \$1200.00 from them to support this effort. Please take time to read about this program below.

THE GIFT is a program initiated by the Walk to Emmaus/Chrysalis movements to ensure that many from all over the world can enjoy the fruits of this beautiful ministry. THE GIFT is a financial program that allows the International communities as well as the emerging new communities to tap into the generosity of pilgrims and butterflies that the Lord has so richly blessed.

Our movement is ecumenical in nature; that is, it reaches across churches and denominations. The Walk to Emmaus and Chrysalis movements receive no money or funding from the United Methodist Church or any other denomination. Financially, we exist through Pilgrim and Butterfly fees and the sale of products and printed materials. These two movements are so powerful and so blessed by the Holy Spirit that they should be able to impact more Christians all over the world. We are committed to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world and to help our brothers and sisters in Christ. To that end, we are going to take a love offering at the beginning of each Fourth Day Meeting after the Walks.

Some of this money will go to the Latin American countries who cannot afford a simple wooden or pewter cross so they use 2 sticks and a strip of a leaf to tie it together. Some will also go to the African countries that get pilgrims and food and teams ready to go on a Walk but then because of the one million percent inflation, cannot afford the facility. The money will also go the European countries as scholarship funds because they cannot afford the subsidized pilgrim fee. We cannot allow money to become an obstacle to grace. Brothers and sisters, it is our responsibility to provide the "First Fruits" funds to facilitate an opportunity for all Christians who want to draw into a closer relationship with Christ to be able to do so.

Our community's emphasis and commitment to "THE GIFT" will have an effect on Butterflies and Pilgrims now and into the future. Many individuals will be able to attend a weekend because of our generosity.

Friends, there are three ways that you help:

- 1. PRAY This may not be the right season for a contribution but you can commit to praying for these movements as we move forward.
- 2. SCHOLARSHIP Sponsorship fees usually fall between \$50.00 and \$125.00 for a Pilgrim or Caterpillar. You can provide the means to allow one or more persons to attend a weekend.
- 3. LARGE GIFT Your spiritual gift of giving has afforded you the means to make a larger gift to these movements.

Please understand that no money collected will go toward salaries or pensions. Not one penny will go to pay the light bill or any expenses.

The International Emmaus and Chrysalis Office is determined to do more than just keep these movements operational. This is a program that is going to be used year after year and will be part of our DNA. When we reprint the Handbooks, it will be included in the chapters on the Fourth Day/Next Steps follow-up meetings. We will list "THE GIFT" as an item to be included in the pilgrim/butterfly packet. We are committed to being the "hands and feet of Christ" in the world. Please join us.

Let It Begin With Me

All it takes is one person who hears the call of God and responds, "Here am I. Send me!" (Isa. 6:8). Perhaps for your world, that person is you. Consider what impact you can have on those around you. Reflect on the Scriptures given above and ask God to give you a longing to see a culture of peace around you that reflects the love and power of his Son. If he gives you that longing, hard work awaits you, but great blessing is also in store, for Jesus' promise in Matthew 5:9 is absolutely dependable: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God."

Food for Thought

It just takes one.

There is a theory in the study of family systems that says if just one person begins to change, then the family changes. For example, if a passive son begins to be more assertive in his decisions and behavior, then the whole family changes. They may look the same, drive the same old Honda, and still play Monopoly every Saturday night, but since he changed, the family is no longer the same. And the courage of one member to change often inspires others to change as well.

So who will begin to change your church's culture, or family's culture, or the culture at work to one of peacemaking? Ken writes: "Perhaps...that person is you." What? Me? Surely not! I mean, doesn't that need to come through the pastor or my boss or the my spouse? I'm just one person. Exactly! That's where change begins--always has, always will. It begins with the man or woman in the mirror. If you begin to practice biblical peacemaking wherever you are, the environment around you will change. It may keep the same street address, involve the same people, be the same work, but it will be different. It all begins with the courage of one with the power of one.


