WOMEN'S WALK - March 15-18, 2018


**THE WALK WILL BE HELD AT OAK PARK RETREAT CENTER IN PERKINS, OK**

## Heard At Closing of the Men's Walk #145—March 4, 2018

This is the closest I have come to God. I'm 71, so it's been a long time. This group will be a part of my life. I am getting closer to Jesus. God has more Grace than we have sin – thank God for that! This is just the start of my process to get closer to Jesus and God.

Last week I was going to be the first guy to flunk out of Emmaus! I found a bunch of guys that struggle with the same things I do. As we go back into the real world, I know how to handle things better.

I finally saw a touch of Agape love. And I didn't realize how much I needed it. There are some things I would like to do in my home town, and I would like to serve Don and his churches and Emmaus.

It was amazing to have 3 days to focus on God while I haven't have 3 hours to do it in the past 20 years. Last night at Candlelight I have never felt closer to God than I did then. I have to throw a lot of things out to be able to get the right things in, and I'm going to start doing that.

My sponsor was trying to get me to do this 2 years ago. I picked up a Bible about 3 months ago, and as I started to understand the scriptures, I realized there was something in me that was not right. It was the Holy Spirit! If it rains 30 inches in 5 minutes it will just roll off, but if it rains that much over 2 weeks, it will soak in! I want to be able to pass along this experience to someone else.

I have never felt as much peace as I have felt here. What am I going to do? I am trying to emulate some of the leaders here (they wake up early).

I heard that I had a couple of people fighting over who was going to be my sponsor! One night, I felt like someone was tapping me on the shoulder. I finally got up and read the scripture that we would study that day. I am just going to open the Word, listen to what He has to tell me, and go from there.

I've had a lot of doubts for a long time. I've finally been able to let go of a lot of things that I needed to let go of. I have courage to tackle some things that I have been putting off.

I'm glad that I had the opportunity to do this. I learned how much Jesus has been reaching for me my entire life – more than I knew. I'm going to take baby steps until I can do the bigger ones. If I stumble, I am going to keep trying until I do it the right way.

I came up here and I didn't know what I was looking for – but I found that Jesus was looking for me! My heart, my mind, my compassion has been opened, and God has shown me these things in ways I didn't understand before.

I feel a little bit like I am floating – I think part of it is the Spirit (or maybe the food?). Very reassuring to see other men having the openness to share and be willing to teach.

I'm a lot closer to God.

I believe it was at least 12 years ago I was supposed to do this the first time, but it turns out God's timing is better than mine. I want to be able to serve in the Emmaus Community and do the hard work of the Kingdom every day.


